About the Composer

JOSEPH BOLOGNE, CHEVALIER DE SAINT-GEORGES



Born in 1745 in Guadeloupe, he was the son of a French plantation owner, George Bologne, and his African slave Nanon. When he was seven, his father relocated him to France permanently. In 1769, he became a member of the Concert des Amateurs and made his début as a solo violinist with the Amateurs in 1772 to critical acclaim. Between 1773 and 1779 he published two sets of string quartets, a dozen violin concertos, and at least 10 symphonies concertantes. His opera *L'Amant Anonyme* received its premiere at the private theater of Mme de Montesson in 1780.

After the Amateurs disbanded in 1781, he founded the Concert de la Loge Olympique (part of the exclusive freemason club La Loge Olympique). After becoming involved with the founders of the abolitionist Société des Amis des Noirs, he found himself denounced and expelled from Belgium and wrote his last opera while bedridden in Lille. He then joined the National Guard, became a victim of the Reign of Terror, and was imprisoned for 18 months. He was able to eventually return to Paris to direct another orchestra at the masonic Cercle de l'Harmonie, and died in 1799.
